Governor Kathleen Sebelius

Kathleen Sebelius was sworn in as Governor of Kansas in 2003 and was elected to a second term in November 2006. Since taking office, Governor Sebelius has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to growing the Kansas economy and creating jobs for Kansas workers. She has been a strong supporter of initiatives designed to make the Kansas business climate more attractive to businesses and has balanced the State budget without raising taxes. The Governor has also made a priority of cutting government waste, helping the State realize nearly \$1 billion in savings during her first term. In 2005, *Time* magazine named her one of the nation's top five Governors, citing her work to curb government spending, as well as her efforts to bridge the partisan divide.

Secretary David Kerr, Kansas Department of Commerce

As Secretary of the Kansas Department of Commerce, David Kerr guides the state's lead economic development organization in its mission to empower individuals, businesses and communities to realize prosperity in Kansas. Kerr oversees the state's efforts to create jobs through business recruitment and expansion, agriculture marketing, workforce development, community development, international trade and travel and tourism.

Secretary Kerr joined Commerce after serving as president of AT&T Kansas from 2003-07, where he was responsible for all regulatory, legislative, governmental and external affairs activities in the state. Prior to being named president, Kerr served as vice president and general manager, Local Interconnection Services, with responsibility for serving competitive local telephone companies.





Ed Barlow, Creating the Future, Inc.

As a student of the future and its implications for Kansas' 21st century economic preparations, Ed Barlow returns to take our understanding to a deeper level. Ed is President of Creating the Future, Inc., and well known within workforce development circles across the United States. He recently keynoted the State Governor's Workforce Conferences in Ohio and Illinois and facilitated a strategic planning retreat for the Board of Directors of the National Association of Workforce Professionals. Ed will facilitate conference discussion and interaction with other speakers and panelists.

Ron Crouch, Kentucky State Data Center

As an expert demographer, Ron Crouch interprets the significant demographic changes that will affect state and local settings. He is well known for his ability to "set the record straight" regarding demographic myths that most people hold. Ron's insights were recently featured in a major *Wall Street Journal* article concerning the new demographic realities facing America. He has developed Census profiles for each of the 50 states that provide information beyond that available from traditional sources. Ron is the Director of the Kentucky State Data Center at the University of Louisville and presents regularly at national and state conferences.



Mary Lou Reed, Okaloosa and Walton Counties, Florida

As an educator, private sector human resource executive and director of government-sponsored employment and training programs, Mary Lou has been zealous in her efforts to link education with the world of work. Her passion for this began when she attended and graduated from Berea College in Kentucky, which was founded and operated on work-study principles. Mary Lou has been instrumental in the development of the CHOICE Institutes in the Florida Panhandle. These institutes are a partnership between the Okaloosa Public Schools, industry clusters and the workforce development system. The Choice Institutes have received numerous national accolades and awards and have become a driving force for reenergizing and reforming career technical education in Florida. Mary Lou currently serves as Executive Director of the Workforce Development Board of Okaloosa and Walton Counties in Florida.

Dr. Frank Fuller, CHOICE Institutes

As a career educator, Dr. Fuller has dedicated himself to school innovation. He served as a principal at the elementary, middle and high school levels and was the founding director of a K-8 charter school. He was selected by the Okaloosa County School Board to lead the CHOICE Institutes initiative as an Assistant Superintendent of Schools. CHOICE is an innovative approach based on a business model designed around industry certifications, which provide students with essential skills for immediate success in the workplace. In its first full year of operation, 1,000 students enrolled in CHOICE Institutes related to Information Technology, Aerospace, Creative Arts and Construction. Enrollment in these programs has now doubled. Other Institutes that will open next year are Allied Health-Medical Devices and Entrepreneurship.

As a former American Marketing Association's Marketer of the Year and a two-time Women Who Mean Business finalist, Celina uses branding and marketing as a catalyst to help agencies position the importance and urgency of their missions, build collaborative partnerships and improve public opinion. She is a strong advocate for workforce and economic development, establishing state, regional and local models that have sustained the test of time despite continued funding cuts.
